### MATT WHITTAKER BEGINNERS BLACKSMITHING

On this course you will first become familiar with hand cranked charcoal hearths on which you will heat up the steel to be forged.

Matt will then take you through the basics of forging your own items, starting off with a small S-hook, then moving onto more demanding coat hooks.

After lunch we move onto bottle openers which use your new skills to the full.

Day two starts with a coat hook warmup to refresh the mind and body. Then the day moves onto larger projects such as decorative fire pokers and toasting forks.









### SAM ANSELL WESTMORLAND PANELS

Learn the arts of splitting, twisting and coaxing hazel rods to make a beautiful woven panel in a traditional regional style.

Sam will teach the traditional heritage craft of Hazel Hurdle making through the smaller Westmoreland Panel construction. A bit easier to take away with you, yet all the techniques you need to succeed.

#### **CAMPING AND FACILITIES**

You have a choice to camp in the fields or woods. The fields are accessible by car to drop your kit off.

There are awesome blocks of toilets, showers and outside sinks beside the lodge.

No dogs are permitted on site.



### WHAT YOU NEED TO BRING

Waterproofs and sturdy footwear are essential. Please also bring a bowl, plate, mug and cutlery and some warm clothes. If you are camping, then appropriate equipment including a torch will be useful.

#### COMING BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

We encourage public transport or lift shares if you can!

Silverdale Train Station is a 0.4 mile walk from SilverHelme. There are regular direct trains to & from Lancaster and easy access to Arnside, Grange and beyond to Cark & Cartmel.

### COMING BY CAR

There is free parking on site and limited capacity for live-in vehicles.

We encourage you to take advantage of this beautiful place and camp in the woods, otherwise, you can reserve your live-in vehicle spot as your book your event tickets.
